TO THE UNSEEN FUTURE

JAMES KIRKPATRICK

November 2, 2018–January 6, 2019

James Kirkpatrick mixes vintage pop-culture imagery found in underground comics, retro video games and outsider science fiction with symbolic references hidden in secret societies. He seamlessly integrates figuration and abstraction; painting and sculpture; drawing and sound; textiles and zines; performance and glitch. Well known for his participation in the early Canadian graffiti movement and as avant-garde hip-hop artist Thesis Sahib, Kirkpatrick delves into contemporary experiences while exploring how art work can function as something that interconnects us to each other.



Outsider

December 7, 2018–February 10, 2019

“An Outsider artist should create an obsessively imagined world, a place where the laws of normal reality are overturned.” – Roger Cardinal

French painter and sculptor Jean Dubuffet coined the term *Art Brut* or *raw art* in the 1940s. Pushing against traditional academic fine art, Dubuffet placed a framework around art created by individuals untouched by the influences of conventional art academies and practice, praising them for their extreme individuality and expressions outside of accepted norms. Best known in North America as *Outsider Art*, this title has been applied and removed in an attempt to define and redefine this specific genre of art. Paintings, drawings, prints and sculptures from the JNAAG permanent collection have been brought together to explore the definition of Outsider Art including the work of Maud Lewis and Scottie Wilson.

Rita Letendre (Drummondville, 1928) is an abstract artist who has lived in Toronto since 1970. Drawing works from JNAAG and Museum London's permanent collections *Chasing Vibrato* investigates Letendre's experiments with new mediums that prompted a stylistic transition from the hard-edged arrows that gained her international recognition to a period dominated by atmospheric haze. In both approaches she makes the surface of her works vibrate through dynamic tension between colour and form.

Feel It Out

January 24

Create relief sculptures using yarn, board, foil and sharpies. The completed results will resemble something between stained glass and metal embossed tile. We'll take part in a discussion about how various types of lines portray feeling in artwork and how colour can affect the emotion of artwork.

Gelli Printing

February 21

Welcome to the world of print making—create your very own designs using specialty squishy Gelli printing plates. Make patterns and texture using acrylic paint, stencils, paper shape cut outs, and tracing implements, then place some paper and transfer your design to heavy card stock. Create exciting reliefs of your prints that you can take home.

Put Some Super in that Original

March 21

Learn how to layer tempera paint and place paper shape stickers on a painting to create contrast. Add the final details in black. We are not painting your typical picture (representational forms)—rather, we are creating a super original abstract painting.

Map Hunt

April 18

Together we will drop and splat drippy lines of a specially made water colour solution on our paper. Paint over this invisible resist and then rub the water colour solution off your paper to reveal a magical map. Finish your map off however you like—where will you go?


