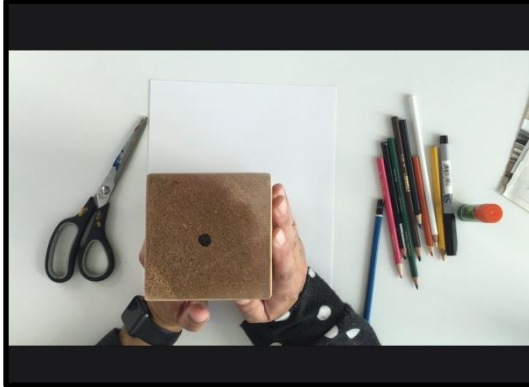
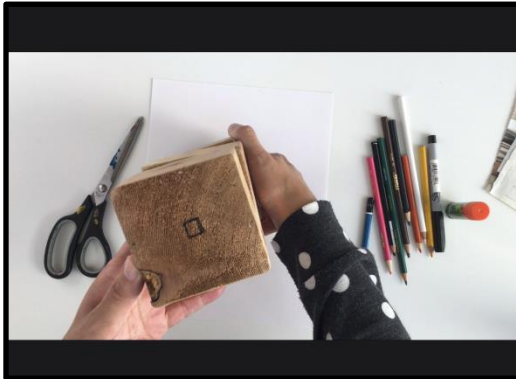


## Drawing Twists: Pencil Crayon Techniques and Collage

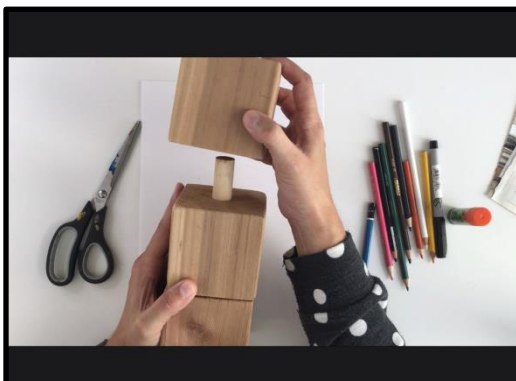


This Make Art Kit includes a set of cedar wood blocks that have been cut and drilled to stack and twist.

The top of the stack has been marked with a circle.

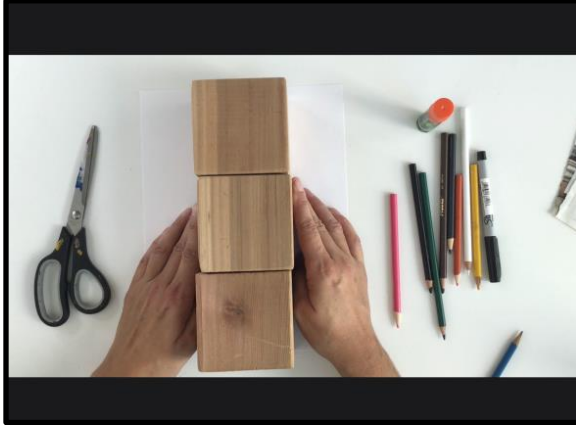


The bottom of the stack has been marked with a square.

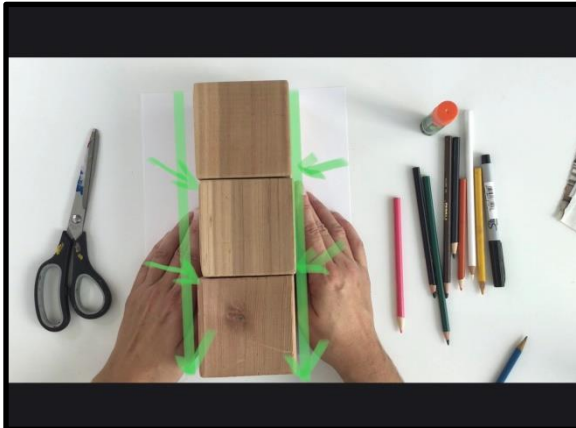


It is possible to slide the top and middle block off of the post. These blocks can be heavy and may be rough, please be careful.

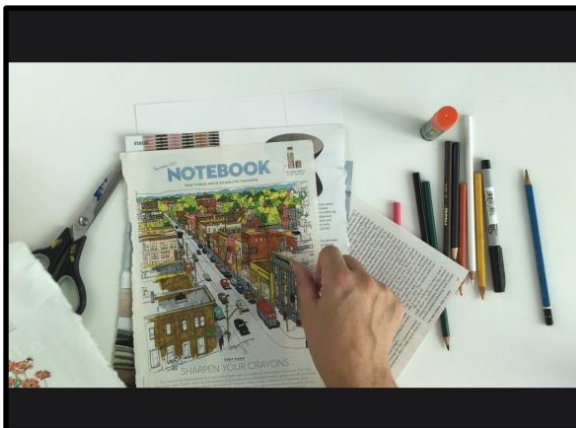
## Drawing Twists: Pencil Crayon Techniques and Collage



Lay the stack of blocks over the centre of the drawing paper.

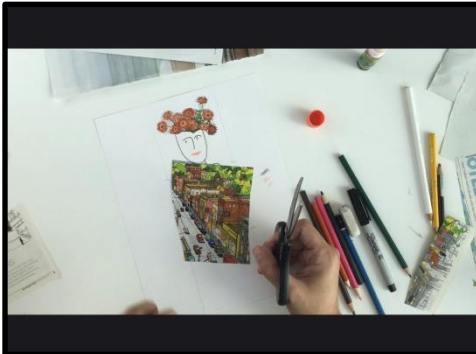


Trace the sides of the blocks to define the area to draw in.  
Mark the space between the blocks to note the top, middle, and bottom.  
Consider drawing a head in the top section, a body in the middle, and feet in the bottom section.

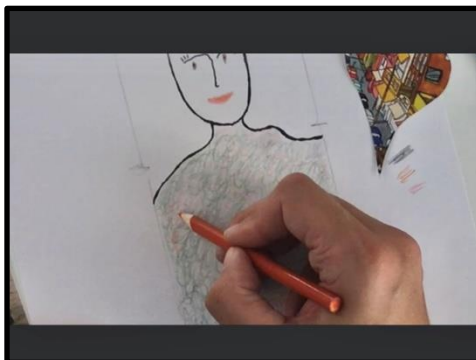


You can use magazine clippings or a photograph to add collage elements to your drawing.

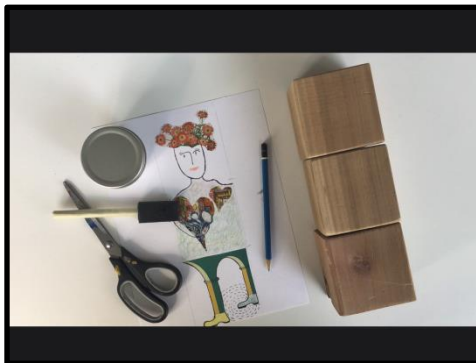
## Drawing Twists: Pencil Crayon Techniques and Collage



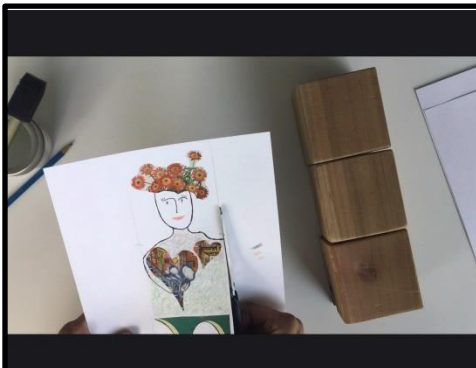
Consider using your collage elements in ways that change what you first saw in them.



Use pencil crayons and a fine tip marker to add shape, texture and details.

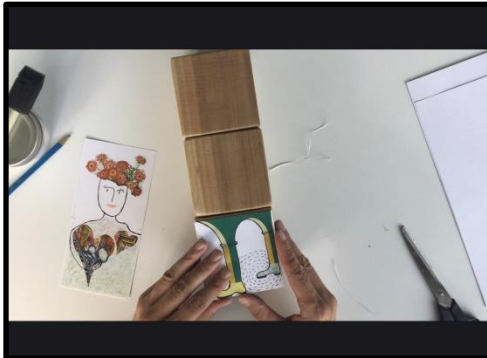


When your drawing is complete, you are ready to attach it to the blocks.

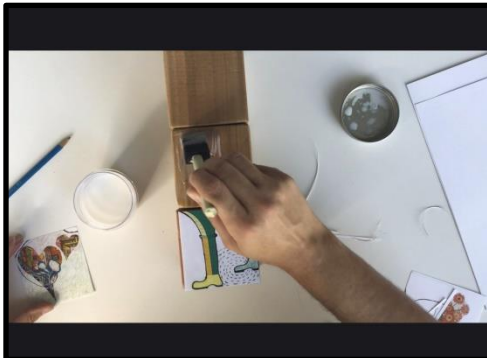


Trim the margins from your drawing and cut along the lines that separate the top, middle and bottom spaces.

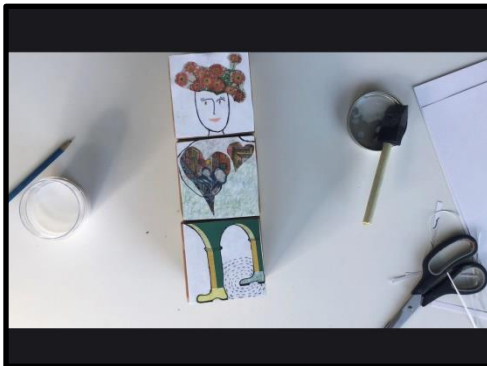
## Drawing Twists: Pencil Crayon Techniques and Collage



Trim the edges of your drawing again if needed so that they do not float off the edges of your block.



Brush the water and glue solution onto the block before adding the piece of your drawing.



Add another layer of glue over top of your drawing to coat and smooth out any air bubbles.



When the glue has dried, repeat the process to add the characters created by local artists. If you are collaborating with someone else add their creation to another side, then pick which included characters you want to morph with.

Twist the blocks to morph your drawing.  
How does this change your character?
